

4 Myanmar nationals to commence their study programs as IDRC-SEARCA scholars

KHON KAEN, Thailand – Coinciding with the start of the academic year, four Myanmar nationals have been chosen to complete the second cohort of graduate scholars under *The Southeast Asian Upland Agriculture Fellowships* project.

All 4 new awardees will take up Master of Rural Development Management in Khon Kaen University (KKU) in Thailand. The degree program is a 15-month intensive collaborative curriculum that “*aims to raise understanding of principles, process, issues and problems confronting rural societies in developing countries, and to identify approaches for their betterment.*” Before starting their postgraduate studies, the new scholars also attended the 2-week Preparation Course for International Students offered by the KKU Graduate School which included modules on the English and Thai languages, and a cultural trip.
